Part of a Hoard of Roman Coins found on Sandford Hill, Somerset.

TWENTY years ago the coins below described passed through my hands, and while in my possession I made a full record of them. They were about the same time (in 1904) purchased from the owner by the late Lt.-Colonel J. R. Bramble, F.S.A., an Hon. Secretary of the Somersetshire Arch. and Nat. Hist. Society, and President at the Westonsuper-Mare Meeting in 1905.

These coins were not sold at the sale of Colonel Bramble's coins at Sotheby, Wilkinson and Hodge's rooms on 25th November, 1908; neither have they been traced since his death. But they are decidedly interesting, and on that account are placed upon record here.

At my suggestion a few years ago, the Rev. C. S. Taylor, F.S.A., of Banwell Vicarage, obtained some information with regard to the discovery of these coins from Mr. George Rich, of Newport, Isle of Wight, who stated that his father, who died about 1878, was once testing Sandford Hill for ore, when the labourer who accompanied him drove his pick into a pot of coins. Further search revealed three crocks in all; of these the workman had one pot, and Mr. Rich two. Unfortunately, George Rich does not know exactly on what part of the hill his father made the discovery.

On the death of the elder Mr. Rich, the coins were divided among his three sons, and a few years ago George was still in possession of the coins—about sixty-five—which fell to his share.

Another son, Frank Rich, who died about 1904, sold a few of his coins to the late Lord Winterstoke (then Sir W. H. Wills), and it is almost certain that the remainder of his share are the fifty-four coins here described.

They consist of twenty-six *Denarii* of silver, and twenty-eight *Antoniniani*¹ of billon, and cover the period A.D. 193 to A.D. 267.

^{2.} Billon is an alloy of silver, with copper, tin, or other base metal, in which the latter predominates.
