SOMERSET PAROCHIAL CLERGY, 1373-1404

In 1932 Sir Henry Maxwell Lyte published in these Proceedings a list of Somerset incumbents for the period 1354-1401, a period for which the episcopal registers of the diocese are missing.1 One of the sources he used, and at second hand, was a list of clergy. with their benefices, dated 1389, which had been published earlier.2 The provenance of this list was not given, and was apparently unknown to Maxwell Lyte. It belongs, in fact, to a series of documents in the Public Record Office known as Significations of Excommunication, and the series contains similar, and sometimes longer, lists of clergy drawn up in 1373, 1374, 1381, 1385, and 1404.3 The composite list of clergy which appears below is drawn from these documents to provide names of clergy and the dates of their appearance to supplement the list published by Maxwell Lyte and the much earlier compilation edited, uncritically, by F. W. Weaver, at the end of the last century.4

The documents which form the sources for the list were produced as part of the process of excommunication. Ecclesiastical authorities, having pronounced an offender excommunicate, were powerless to proceed against him further. Forty days had to elapse after sentence and if, at the end of that time, the offender remained obdurate the king's chancery was notified of the fact by the writ Significavit. This writ sought the aid of the secular authority to arrest him.5 The present list of clergy is drawn from six such writs sent by successive bishops of Bath and Wells for secular aid against those who had incurred excommunication for not paying taxes imposed on ecclesiastical property. In itself the offence was not uncommon, but in the period in question opposition to heavy taxation was widespread. The revolt of the laity, in part against the poll taxes levied by Richard II's government, is well known; it is less often realised that clerical opposition was equally common, involving in Bath and Wells diocese alone 27 beneficed clergy and chaplains in 1374, 67 in 1381, 26 in 1385, 11 in 1389, and 51 in 1404.6

Other names were also included in these writs. In each year there were laymen and clergy who were leasing church property; and in 1381 a number of monks were involved, including Hildebrand Inge, master of the priory of St. John at Minchin Buckland,7 and Abbot John and nine monks of Cleeve.8

The following list is arranged alphabetically according to the parish concerned. Some clergy were clearly not incumbents in the parish under which they appear: John Blake, for example, was described as clericus de Bridgwater, a phrase which implies inferior status. The words 'clerk' and 'chaplain' have in this list been used, as in the originals, to signify position as parochial clerk or chantry chaplain, and not as a description of a grade in Holy Orders. The letterrs ML and W refer to the lists published by Maxwell Lyte and Weaver.
