# THE A. V. CORNISH COLLECTION

North Gloucestershire Ornithological Report (1961)

The most notable acquisition in this section during the year has been the collection formed by the late A. V. Cornish. Antiquities found by him on Ham Hill were deposited on loan in 1907, with additions in 1910 and 1914. These are listed in *Proceedings* 53 (1907), i, 72-74; 56 (1910), i, 95-96; 60 (1914), i, 93-95. The collection was withdrawn in 1920 and remained in Mr. Cornish's possession until his death in 1961. After 1920 a few items from Ham Hill were added, but the bulk of the collections formed since then consists of material (chiefly flint implements) from Minehead and its neighbourhood, and includes two stone axes — the first to be reported from the coastal area of West Somerset. All the antiquities from Ham Hill, with a small collection of coins, have been given to the Museum by Mrs. Cornish; the material from Minehead has been deposited on loan. A list of the latter will appear in the next volume of *Proceedings*.
