

and a J.P. from 1646-78, being reappointed at the Restoration. In 1650 he was appointed a sequestrator for Somerset and Bristol and the appointment was upheld by Ashe and the Committee for Compounding, against the opposition of Colonel Pyne, but friction in the Somerset committee continued and Buckland was not among the five commissioners who took the place of Pyne's committee at the end of the year. He was a commissioner to deal with 'insufficient' ministers and with rights of common in Selwood in 1655, and M.P. again for Somerset in 1656-7 and 1658-9. In 1661 Buckland paid £20 to a subsidy. He was a commissioner against recusants in 1675, part patron of Alford, 1661, Wheathill 1676, on behalf of Sir Charles Waldegrave, and Hinton Bluet, 1675.

John Harrington.

John Harrington of Kelston and Corston, second but eldest surviving, son of John Harrington, M.P., born *circ.* 1627 ; educated at Lincoln College, Oxford ;=(1) 1654, Mary daughter of Peter Specot of Thornbury, by whom he had one son John, o.s.p., and three daughters, Dionysia=(1) Henry Long and (2) Colthrop Parker ; Elizabeth=Henry Gibbs, mayor of Bristol, and Mary. (2) 1662, Anne daughter of Sir John Horner, M.P., by whom he had one daughter, Anne,=Sir Robert Chaplin. (3) *circ.* 1664, Alice Snow (?), by whom he had one son, Benjamin and six daughters, Virtue = Joshua Higginson, Amy = Rev. David Macye, Alice=(1) Edward Chetwynd, (2) Rev. Thomas Feckenham, Rebecca, Phoebe and Jane. (4) 1678, Helena, daughter of Benjamin Gostlett ; died 1700. Harrington was a J.P. for Somerset, 1654-85 ; captain of a troop of horse in the Somerset militia, 1654, and a commissioner to enquire into illegal exports of wool, 1658. In 1660 a petition signed by
