FAMILY FRIENDLY EVENTS

Events suitable for Family members are indicated. Please note that children remain the responsibility of their parents/carers at all times throughout the visit.

GRADING OF WALKS This key is intended as a general guide to the level of difficulty likely to be encountered by participants taking part in SANHS walks and other activities. Keep in mind that a change in weather conditions can make a walk more difficult than anticipated. All walks and activities demand a basic level of fitness, suitable footwear and waterproof clothing.

- Easy generally even ground with a few gentle slopes; no special fitness needed. Comfortable footwear required.
- Moderate for reasonably fit people, may include unsurfaced rural paths and tracks, moderate slopes, uneven surfaces, steps and stiles. Walking shoes/boots required.
- 3 Strenuous for fit, experienced walkers, will include hills, uneven surfaces, tracks and may include muddy terrain. Walking boots and waterproof clothing are essential.
- Confined spaces including caves and attics. Locations may be dusty, slippery and dark.

Activity leaders carry out a risk assessment beforehand. Participants are required to provide emergency contact details before taking part in an activity – this information is destroyed by the group leader after the activity has taken place.


